Principal's Report:

- Thank you to the SMPO for the breakfast
- Book fair this week Ms. Finney is dressing up as Clifford this week
- 2nd & 6th grader's Terra Nova reports will be coming home soon
- Student Council is sponsoring a canned food drive
- Lockdown drill went well a few weeks ago constantly working to make sure everyone is safe

• ILT has been working on the One Plan - Reading, math, and advisory goals. Partnering with Beech Acres in the area of mindfulness

• Crossroads – "Go Cincinnati" project partnering with the Sands garden committee in May (Tara Brock will have more information on this in January)

LSDMC – Richard Grosse spoke about LSDMC.

• The committee generated a survey monkey –based upon their goals/wishes (tutoring, diversity, etc.) to see what the parents/general population wants LSDMC to focus on

- Krista Clark is helping Jackie to get a grant from "Annie's Home Grown" for the garden
- Craig said that two of the LSDMC grants went to garden committees last year

• Amy Scharffe suggested Garden Supply Company for mesh enclosures for the raised beds to protect the crop from animals

Business Manager, Jennifer Garcia -

- New SMPO community events section to the budget (has not yet been voted on)
- Spiritwear was under athletics so Jen pulled it out as a separate line

• Education/Technology Fund Drive (Gina Brenner)- we are looking into a program that will possibly help to organize online donations

Teacher Rep, Kelli Jasper -

• Some teachers are wondering about the amount allocated for direct classroom support this year. Jen Garcia will get this information out to teachers, she has that number for them.

- Jen Garcia just sent an email yesterday about field trip buses (everyone gets \$161 for one school bus within the 275 loop). There is a new form in the office in the red crate for this purpose.

• Regarding the color printer purchased last year for the teachers - \$700 is needed for new ink cartridges Discussion followed... Jen Garcia said that an SMPO request form will need to be filled out and pre-approved by the administration

Kelli Jasper said that there was discussion of using direct classroom support money (\$20 per teacher going toward ink) or the cost of the ink can possibly be added to the budget as a new line item Krista Clark – this could be considered a "gift" out of the teacher appreciation budget

Kelly Crantford – when was the printer given to the teachers? How much will this ink cost per year?

• Chess for Recess, Annette Delaney – this program will run during recess again this year in Ms. Delaney's room December 4th- January 29th

Reporter, Chelsea Meyers - not in attendance

Fundraising, Jana Stark

• Presented a fundraising plan for the rest of the year (see attached)

• Gina Brenner – All of these events are new and experimental and their success or failure will determine what we do again in the future

December: Winter Fest - projected income \$1500. Zak Morgan is coming to perform!

January: Father/Son Game Night and Mother/Daughter Pajama Party (25 couples needed to break even or event is cancelled)

February: Sands Montessori Read-a thon - Projected income \$7,000 (Pledge Goal \$20/student) *March*: Sands Box consignment sale (children's clothing, toys, bedding, books) 50 sellers (\$1875), 80 sellers (\$3,000) 25/75 split

Silent Auction – Polly Camery has offered to chair – but we need 4-5 people to commit to getting donations and working hard to get the event planned

May: In the event that a Silent Auction does not take place there is a possibility of a Walk-a-Thon or Color Run at the end of the year – the monies brought in from this event would take the place of classroom baskets from the auction.
