## Principal's Report

Current Enrollment: 690

After Round 2 magnet enrollment, 3 additional 6 th graders were offered slots. If they return the paperwork, this would bring the total to 9 new 6th graders. Our sixth grade team has planned an orientation meeting for new families Thursday night and is working to schedule shadow days for each of the student.

We are proud to announce that our hardworking 3-6 team once again earned 4 stars for our Step up to Quality rating.

We are very proud of all of students who read 200,010 minutes during our Read-a-Thon and raised $\$ 14,653.24$ for our school. Ms. Karen's class won $\$ 50$ for the most minutes read by a class and each grade level winner will join me on a limo ride to Buca di Beppo on Friday.

Staff meeting on Monday, $3 / 12$, we worked on teams to better equip students and parents for the transitions at each level at our school. Dean Blase from Clark Montessori and Jessica Smitson and Kathy Restle from Walnut Hills joined us to share about 7th grade expectations.

We are emphasizing Character Strengths on the Announcements and are noticing that students are increasingly aware of the strengths. Beech Acres and Dr. Elizabeth collaborated with paraprofessionals to review and refresh consistent expectations for recess.
