- Tonight's meeting was hosted by Courtney Ryan, SMPO President.
- Courtney reviews the Sands Mission for inspiration.
- Chris Vockell motions to approve the meeting minutes from October.
- Shanice Wood seconds the motion.
- Meeting minutes approved at 6:38pm.
- Courtney dives right in with a discussion about the new library furniture and making a motion to approve it. Robyn shares that she has been doing some research about a different company and expresses that she would like to use the library budget to pay for any costs exceeding $\$ 15,000$. She plans to look into the quality and warranty situations with the new potential company.
- Heather asks for clarification on where the extra money for the library budget would really come from because the money we raise this year would need to be used next year...
- Jen points out that she is going to be $\$ 1,000$ under

- Courtney facilitates the vote.
- The motion to spend $\$ 15,000$ on community furniture (that will live in the library) is approved with a unanimous yes!

- Fuel Up Ambassadors hosted the pumpkin election
- Class Dojo has taken off and is and rocking!
- 929 skills were celebrated in the 1st week alone and we have received 100 percent positive feedback. Need to spread the word in order to get families connected.

> Michelle Durban:
- Checking 57, 816.35
- Savings 33,104.45
- most of our expenses have been from conference night dinners and a few mini grant field trip purchases,
- taxes have been filed and we will be paying accountant a big fee soon

$>$ Kim F. and Karen H. speak on SMPO and Student Council collaboration:

- Raised $\$ 240.00$ from bake sales during conference nights and book fair night
- Going to host staff holiday breakfast the last day before winter break
- Going to do a canned food drive; planning with Cybil
- Going to get most of the candy shipped for treats for the troops
- Looking into hosting a winter dance at the end of January/beginning of February for grades 4-6.
- need to confirm with Sara and Cybil so we can book a DJ and move full steam ahead!
> Heather Gerker and Allyse Sonnega:
- Our team has been busy! Stephanie is working hard to strengthen community connections by creating a Sands Montessori Family Directory. It's completely optional to add your family details but if you are interested, fill out this form here. She also started a Sands Families Buy Nothing Holiday Season Facebook Group - check it out here! Allyse is leading the way with the Donuts with Grownups plans. This event is an updated version of "Grandparents Day," scheduled for November 22. We've had a great response for volunteers and donut donations! Currently working on plans for coffee and ironing out all the details of the day. Heather has been focused on feeding our teachers - we served Larosa's pizza and pasta for the first conference night and for the second conference night, Currito Burrito bowls were on the menu.
> Jen Robbins:
- All extra curricular classes and their providers are returning for the Spring sessions.
- We are not using all of our scholarship money according to the budget.
- SMPO provides $60 \%$ of cost for extracurriculars to families in need based on their financial status
- asks that the SMPO give money to families in need if child writes a letter about why they want to be in the class instead of being based on proof of income
- only gave away $\$ 1,087$ to families this year. There were limited applicants this year
- only spent $\$ 877.00$ in scholarships this year

■ I enjoy the Homeroom system for enrollment in extracurriculars; it also allows people to contribute a donation towards families in need

- Proposes that the SMPO increase their contribution from 60\% to 70\% for scholarships and make it more available for families;
- if we bump it up, we will still be under the budget level. Explains that by bumping the scholarship money to $70 \%$, SEP will still be $\$ 1,200$ under budget, especially if donations remain stable and attendance stays up.
- Karen discusses her dislike of Homeroom as a provider;
- parents are paying more for a service and instructors are going home with less.
- would like for Homeroom to offer families the option of paying with something other than credit cards.
-Courtney proposes that we think about incorporating Homeroom fees into the budget.
-Courtney approves 70\% scholarship coverage!
> Amy Hueneman:
- We have filled all but 4 rooms for the Room Parent role! They are actively sharing information for our next event, 11/22 Donuts with Grown Ups.
- We have almost all slots filled but need some extra help for the later morning slot - Allyse Sonnega has the details.
- The newsletter request for Room Parents has been updated to search for volunteers for the remaining 4 rooms.

> Dave Rolfes:
- The Saturday outdoor campus fund drive was a hit!
- Gives a special shout out to Pizza To The People for donating their tip money and a portion of their sales back to the SMPO
- Kicked off fundraiser for outdoor campus with a goal of raising $\$ 3,000$ from the Sands community and within a day we received an email from an anonymous donor that agreed to match the $\$ 3,000$ !
- $\$ 5,952$ raised so far, and with the $\$ 3,000$ match, we have $\$ 8,952$ total plus an additional $\$ 3,900$ from June and July bringing us up to about $\$ 12,000$ raised for the outdoor campus just from asking!
- "Giving Tuesday" is Tuesday, November 29th
- asks for donations on that day
- Chipotle fundraiser raised $\$ 151.00$
